Illinois Association of College and Research Libraries Annual Report

July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2024

This report describes the array of programs that the Illinois Association of College and Research Libraries (IACRL) offered to academic librarians to promote networking and professional development in 2023-2024.

IACRL has largely moved to virtual programming for reasons of convenience and accessibility. In November of 20223, the Conference and Continuing Education Committee (C&CE) offered "Disability 101 and Neurodiversity: A Primer" with JJ Pionke as speaker. In March, C&CE offered the panel discussion "Kickstart OER with Grant Funding, aka 'So I've Been Named Project Director/Manager ... What Does That Mean?" with Kim Hale (Columbia College), Lauren Kosrow (College of DuPage), Cathy Mayer (Elgin Community College) and Dan Matthews (Moraine Valley Community College), and each of these speakers talked about their experiences in applying for OER grants and gave their advice. Finally, C&CE offered "Connection with Kaetrena Davis Kendrick: Clarifying Low Morale in Libraries" in April. The IACRL Communications Committee produced the customary fall and spring newsletters as well as promoted these programs.

IACRL had a presence at the ILA Annual Conference, October 24-26, 2023, in Springfield, Illinois. Most notably, we had our annual Unconference event on Wednesday, October 25, and the IACRL Luncheon was also on the 25th. The luncheon was a great opportunity for attendees to network and chat. After IACRL President Sarah McHone-Chase delivered a membership report, the attendees enjoyed a prerecorded talk from the luncheon speaker, Fobazi Ettarh. Like every year, IACRL had a booth in the exhibit hall to promote our forum and answer related questions.

The DEI Committee has been hard at work trying to define direction. The committee has designated liaisons to other committees doing similar work within ILA, RAILS, and elsewhere. The committee has also been looking at the status of a toolkit and discussing how to best enhance and promote that toolkit's use.

The IACRL Awards Committee had a busy year as well. Three publications were awarded the 2024 IACRL People's Choice Award:
