

# **Developing Local History Space**

The Mattoon Public Library has developed a seven room center with museum-type displays that are a destination for local residents, visitors, and to a variety of local groups, including class reunions. The community's history is highlighted at other places in our 26,000 square foot building. The center is led by a volunteer curator. The center's development sparked adult programming, including a recent presentation on Mattoon and the Civil War attended by more than 100 people. The center's development has helped fuel the library's efforts to raise funds and raise the library's community profile.

### Growing and Thriving in Your Library Career
